To be considered for a place in the course, you will need to firstly meet the entrance requirements.

To work out if you meet the **entrance requirements** for the course start with this question



Entrance requirements are the lowest education level you need to get into the course

Am I a school leaver?	Am I a non-school leaver applicant?	Have I completed a qualification previously?	Not sure where you fit or don't have the schooling?
You fit into the school leaver category if you are still at school or have completed school within the last 12 months.	You fit into this category if you completed or left school over 12 months ago.	You fit into this category if you have completed an Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) qualification through a registered training organisation.	Contact TAFE Admissions and we can help.

What education do I need to have reached to be able to get into the course?

School Leaver	Non-School Leaver	Completed a qualification
You need to have completion of WACE General or ATAR (minimum C Grades) or equivalent	You need to have completion of WACE General or ATAR (minimum C Grades) or equivalent	You have completed a Certificate III or higher through a registered training organisation (this includes TAFEs and privately training colleges).

This course has extra requirements as set by North Metropolitan TAFE.

To be considered for a place in this course you need to sit a LLN Robot literacy and numeracy assessment. You will receive more information about these requirements after you make your application.





Who gets a place? 

Once you meet the entrance requirements we put all applicants into a pool, and the strongest applicants are offered a place.

To determine the strongest applicants; TAFE Admissions looks at schooling, completed qualifications and working history.

 **Working history** is any paid employment (full-time, part-time or casual), any volunteer work and any work experience or workplace learning completed through school or whilst studying
